Through its Regenesi project, Liverpool Plains Shire Council offers local landowners financial and technical support to plant trees in order to:

- sequester (capture and store) carbon dioxide in response to climate change
- earn carbon trading income for the landowners
- meet additional environmental objectives identified by the landowners, including enhancing biodiversity, providing windbreaks and reducing soil salinity.

Regenesi revegetates sites primarily to sequester carbon and enhance biodiversity. This innovative carbon sequestration project is being conducted jointly by Liverpool Plains Shire Council and its Sister City Blacktown City Council and made possible through a \$2 million grant from the NSW Environmental Trust's Urban Sustainability Program.

Namoi Catchment Management Authority (NCMA) is a foundation stakeholder in the Regenesi project. Regenesi continues to work closely with NCMA to ensure that the Regenesi revegetation works are consistent with and complementary to NCMA objectives.

Regenesi also engages with the local community and businesses through community and corporate planting events and other activities.
